“GLORY TO GOD” SCHOLARSHIP



OVERVIEW

1. Objective and Requirements

Believing that the purpose of a Christian education is to enable the student to know God, fulfill God's plan, and thereby glorify Him, the donors are establishing this scholarship with the following guidelines:

1. The donors pledge a total of \$34,000 over 4 years, with \$8,500 due upon acceptance of this scholarship plan and three payments of \$8,500 on the anniversary of the acceptance of this scholarship fund in subsequent years.
2. The donors desire to fund a scholarship for one incoming freshman beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, with expectations that he/she would commit to graduating from Kaimuki Christian School (KCS) in 2023.
3. The donors' first choice is that the recipient would come from a public school, but in the absence of a qualified recipient from a public school, one from a private school will be considered.
4. The recipient must require financial assistance. The recipient's parent(s) will need to present proof of their need for financial assistance to KCS (i.e., current tax returns).
5. The recipient must have a minimum of a 2.5 GPA and possess clear and outstanding potential in academics, civics, religion, the arts, or some other area that would glorify God.
6. Renewal of the award over the three subsequent years will require maintenance of at least a 2.5 GPA in each year, as well as adherence to the behavioral expectations required of KCS students, as described in the KCS student handbook.
7. The recipient must provide 1-3 recommendation letters from his/her school counselor, teacher, coach, or another significant adult (e.g., a youth pastor, a Common Grace mentor, etc.).
8. The full amount of the scholarship, \$8,500, will be applied directly to the recipient's KCS tuition each year. If the recipient does not continue at KCS, the scholarship will not be transferred to another school or applied to other expenses. The donors will confer with the KCS administration to determine the wisest way to allocate the remaining funds to another qualified recipient.
9. The recipient must be committed to exemplifying the glory that man can give God through positive, creative, and thankful attitudes and actions within the recipient's school, community, country and church.

2. Process

The selection committee will consist of the KCS faculty & staff who are involved with the interview and acceptance of incoming students to KCS' freshman class. These faculty & staff members will review the application and recommendation letter(s) from potential scholarship recipient(s). Confidential recommendations will be submitted by July 31 of each school year to the KCS Principal and KCC Lead Pastor (or their designees), who will make the final decision for each class.

3. Timeline

This scholarship will be given once to the recipient that is selected, prior to the start of the 2019-20 school year.
